Item Specific Fundraising

Focused on Essentials

- Examples:
 - Equipment sponsorships.
 - Uniform crowdfunding.
 - "Adopt-an-Item" campaigns



Item Specific Fundraising

- Create sponsorship opportunities for specific items, where donors contribute directly toward the cost of a particular item.
- Create a public "wish list" of needed items
- Set up crowdfunding campaigns on platforms to specifically highlighting the item needed
- Reach out to local businesses, in exchange for advertising



Event Specific Fundraising

Community Engagement through Events

- Ideas:
 - Charity games.
 - Sports clinics.
 - Themed nights.





- Charge admission for a special event, such as a gala dinner or exhibition game, and include a fundraising component.
- Sell branded merchandise designed specifically for the event.
- Offer different sponsorship levels for the event, where sponsors can contribute financially in exchange for advertising.
- "Fund-a-Need" or Online Fundraisers During the Event: If the event is in person, consider a "Fund-a-Need" paddle raise for direct donations during a live auction. For online events, integrate real-time fundraising through interactive donation platforms.

Team Specific Fundraising

Supporting Individual Teams Ideas:

- Branded merchandise.
- Player sponsorships.
- Youth sports camps.





- Find local businesses or community organizations willing to sponsor a specific team. Offer various levels of sponsorship with benefits.
- Have players participate in fundraising activities, where they gather pledges based on performance metrics or participation.
- Sell season passes for fans to attend all team games at a reduced rate. Part of the funds raised goes directly to the team.
- Allow community members to "adopt" a player by making a one-time or recurring donation. In return, donors receive regular updates about the player and the team.

Holistic Approach

- Facility naming rights.
- Annual banquets.
- Alumni campaigns.





Host an annual giving campaigns targeted at alumni, parents, and the community to support athletics.

- Create tiered booster club memberships that come with benefits like preferred seating, reserved parking, or exclusive event invitations.
- For larger-scale fundraising, offer naming rights for facilities or parts of them, such as the field, court, or weight room. Additionally, an endowment program can generate sustainable funds, with donations generating interest that funds athletic programs long-term.
- Host annual fundraising banquets or galas where ticket sales, auctions, and donation drives support the entire athletic department.


